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8	MS. KORBULIC: Put your mics on mute if you're
9	not speaking. There is an opportunity at the beginning
10	and the end of this meeting for public comment. And
11	when you come on, if you would like to make public
12	comment, please mute and then announce yourself. And
13	then please go back on mute when you're done speaking.
14	With that, Dr. Jameson, I'm happy to hand you
15	the mic, and you can begin.
16	DR. JAMESON: Excellent. Yes, I heard that
17	there were 20 or more on the call. So I believe we
18	probably do have a quorum. And we will know as I ask
19	you to go ahead. I'll call the meeting to order. And
20	if we can have roll call on your end. Thank you.
21	MS. KORBULIC: Sure. Dr. Jameson?
22	DR. JAMESON: Present.
23	MS. KORBULIC: Valerie Clark?
24	MS. CLARK: Present.
25	MS. KORBULIC: Lavonne Lewis?

1 Okay. Dr. Cook? DR. COOK: Present. 2 MS. KORBULIC: Jonathan Johnson? 3 MR. JOHNSON: Present. 4 MS. KORBULIC: Jose Melendrez? He did tell me 5 he was not going to be able to make it today. 6 7 Quincy Branch? MR. BRANCH: Present. 8 MS. KORBULIC: Thank you. 9 Suzanne Bierman? 10 MS. BIERMAN: Hi, this is Suzanne. 11 MS. KORBULIC: Okay. Commissioner Richardson? 12 COMMISSIONER RICHARDSON: Present. 13 MR. MELENDREZ: Hello. This is Jose. 14 MS. KORBULIC: Oh, hi, Jose. Jose Melendrez is 15 currently present. 16 MS. LEWIS: Lavonne Lewis. 17 MS. KORBULIC: Okay. I will mark Lavonne here. 18 And Commissioner Richardson is here. 19 20 And the final roll call for Lynnette Aaron? MS. AARON: Present. 2.1 MS. KORBULIC: Okay. Just a reminder, please 2.2 make sure you mute your mic. We can hear all of your 23 background noise. If you could please make sure you 24 mute your mic unless you're speaking. 2.5

And before we begin, has Dennis Belcourt 1 joined? 2 Okay. I'd like to ask that we want to go ahead, and 8 any public comment? 9 MR. BARRY GOLD: Yes, there is public comment, 10 11 please. DR. JAMESON: Go ahead. And, I think, there is 12 no north, south. And calling for everybody on line. So 13 go ahead and state your name, and please continue with 14 15 your public comment. MR. BARRY GOLD: Yeah, for the record, my name 16 Barry Gold. I'm the Director of Government Relations 17 for AARP Nevada. 18 And AARP Nevada would like to commend Nevada 19 20 Health Link, the staff, the Executive Director, and the 21 Board for opening the special enrollment period allowing Nevadans to have access to insurance when they so 2.2 desperately need it. And in this meeting, when they're 23 going to be considering regulations to extend that 24 special enrollment period, AARP strongly urges you to

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- 1 support, we support that and hope that you extend that
- 2 | special enrollment period, again, to continue people's
- 3 need to get insurance. What a great thing to do. And
- 4 AARP thanks you.
- 5 And that's the end of my public comment.
- DR. JAMESON: Thank you so much for your
- 7 appreciation, your positive comments for our extremely
- 8 hardworking staff under these very stressful
- 9 circumstances. Your positive comments are so
- 10 appreciated.
- Is there anyone else with public comment?
- 12 | Having not heard anyone else, I'd like to ask
- 13 | if we -- am I on mute, or can you hear me?
- MS. KORBULIC: We can hear you, Madam Chair.
- DR. JAMESON: Oh. Oh, very good. I'd like to
- 16 ask if there's anybody -- oh, if we'll go ahead, then,
- 17 on our minutes from our last meeting. This was the
- 18 | emergency approval from last meeting. That minutes from
- 19 then, if we could go ahead and ask for a motion to
- 20 approve.
- 21 UNIDENTIFIED WOMAN: There are no minutes to
- 22 approve.
- DR. JAMESON: Hello?
- 24 MS. CLARK: Valerie Clark. I would make a
- 25 | motion to approve.

Is there a second? 1 DR. JAMESON: MR. JOHNSON: Jonathan Johnson. Second. 2 DR. JAMESON: Excellent. And everybody in 3 favor, if you'd please say "aye." 4 (Board members said "aye.") 5 DR. JAMESON: Is there any opposition to the 6 7 motion, do we hear any opposition? Not hearing any opposition, the motion is 8 carried. 9 Heather, just for the moment I have lost my 10 internet. Could you possibly --11 MS. KORBULIC: Sure. Happy to. 12 DR. JAMESON: -- bring up to the next item? 13 14 I've changed my location. MS. KORBULIC: No problem. Okay. So we are 15 currently on agenda item number III, for possible 16 action, and it is the approval of regulations to extend 17 the one-time, exceptional circumstance, special 18 enrollment period related to the COVID-19 pandemic. 19 20 Madam Chair, I'm happy to announce that and 21 bring the Board up to speed on what it is that's for consideration today. 2.2 Heather, thank you so much. DR. JAMESON: 23 Ιf you would go ahead and bring us up to speed. And, of 24

course, I know that we received some of what's already

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been going on. So we just approved time period. We are
all really excited about hearing that. Thank you.

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MS. KORBULIC: Okay. Great. Thank you.

Thank you, members of the Board, for being here today. And we apologize for the sudden nature of the meetings that we've been having lately. But, as you know, there are unusual circumstances.

So the last time we met, on March 17th, the Board of the Exchange approved emergency regulations that were promulgated by Governor Steve Sisolak that established an exceptional circumstance special enrollment period under the authorities that are provided to State-Based Exchanges outlined in federal statute 45 CFR 155.420 and, also, state statute NRS 695I.370, subsection 2.

The emergency regulation resulted from the declared statewide emergency related to the novel Coronavirus, or the COVID-19 pandemic disease outbreak. The regulation provided, this regulation provided the Exchange with the immediate authority to open a one-time exceptional circumstance SEP to allow qualified individuals who did not seek qualified health plan coverage during open enrollment to enroll in plan year 2020 coverage.

The Exchange has received significant interest

in the previously established exceptional circumstance special enrollment period. Uninsured and underinsured Nevadans recognize the importance of health insurance and are seeking access to the Exchange's comprehensive health plans and premium assistance.

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As Nevada and the nation continue to experience the negative economic and health related consequences of the COVID-19 pandemic outbreak, Nevadans have an increased need to access comprehensive and affordable benefits offered only through Nevada Health Link.

With support from Governor Sisolak, the
Exchange insurance carriers, and all of our other
stakeholders, the Exchange Executive team recommends
that the Board approve of the following regulation to
expand the established deadline of the previously
adopted regulation from April 15th of 2020 to May 15th,
2020 to allow qualified individuals who did not seek
qualified health plan coverage during open enrollment to
gain access to plan year 2020 coverage.

The outlined regulations that were provided in the Board packets is literally what I've just said in the summary section and makes three small changes. The first is that it changes the end date of the exceptional circumstance special enrollment from April 15th to May 15th, and then adds information that qualified

- 1 | individuals who complete enrollment between April 16th,
- 2 2020 and April 30th, 2020 will have a coverage effective
- 3 date of May 1st, 2020. Any qualified individuals who
- 4 | complete enrollment between May 1st and May 15th will
- 5 have coverage effective June 1st, 2020.
- 6 Madam Chair, members of the Board, happy to
- 7 answer any questions that the Board may have.
- 8 DR. JAMESON: And I've just unmuted. This is
- 9 | Florence Jameson, Chair. And I have no further
- 10 questions having heard your attachment.
- Do any of the Board members have anything about
- 12 | the extension for approval for the NAC 695 for the
- 13 extension of the SEP?
- MR. MELENDREZ: Yeah, this is Jose, real quick.
- 15 | Heather?
- MS. KORBULIC: Yes.
- MR. MELENDREZ: So what are we -- how long are
- 18 | we extending it to?
- MS. KORBULIC: It's been for 30 days, which is
- 20 | the max, for a total of 60 days, which is the maximum
- 21 | allotted SEP period that a State-Based Exchange can
- 22 open.
- MR. MELENDREZ: Okay. All right. So when
- 24 | would that take it up to?
- MS. KORBULIC: To May 15th of 2020 would be the

1 | file closing date.

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MR. MELENDREZ: And is there any possibility that, you know, this thing continues and people still need to; would we be able to move beyond that, or would that be some kind of White House order or something?

MS. KORBULIC: At this point, we've exhausted our abilities to use this special enrollment period. However, we could discuss other opportunities at that time.

I will also add here that individuals throughout the state who may be losing access to their health insurance as a result of becoming suddenly unemployed has 60 days from the date that they lose their health insurance coverage to get enrolled in an SEP, or a special enrollment period, on the Exchange. And that's year-round. It's independent of their exceptional circumstance special enrollment period that the Board is about to vote for today.

MR. MELENDREZ: Thank you.

20 DR. JAMESON: Jose, good clarification. Thank
21 you.

Okay. As there are no other questions, then I would ask for an approval of the regulation to extend a one-time exceptional circumstance special enrollment period related to the COVID-19 pandemic to the April --

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to the 15th.
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             MR. MELENDREZ: To the 15th.
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             DR. JAMESON: 4-30 date, a lot of the time.
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             MS. LEWIS: This is Lavonne Lewis. I move
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    approval of the regulation.
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             MR. MELENDREZ: This is Jose. Second.
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             DR. JAMESON: Everybody in favor, please say
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    "aye."
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             (Board members said "aye.")
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             DR. JAMESON: Is there anybody, anyone who
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   opposes?
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             There being no opposition, I am saying the
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   motion has passed unanimously. Thank you, everyone.
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             I would like to ask if there's now any other
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   comments by Heather before we request public comment
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   again.
             MS. KORBULIC: No, Madam Chair. Thank you very
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   much to you and the Board. The Exchange is ready to
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   roll this out and implement the extension. So I really
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   appreciate your support.
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             DR. JAMESON: We appreciate everything that you
    and your amazing staff have done to help in all
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   situations and especially this extremely exceptional
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   circumstance.
             That having said, is there any public comment?

MINDY PRETNER: Just I would like to tell 1 you that I'm getting called every day for people to 2 And so we're happy that you're extending. 3 MS. KORBULIC: Okay. Thank you. Would you 4 please just announce yourself for the record. 5 MS. MINDY PRETNER: I'm sorry. My name's Mindy 6 7 Pretner. And I'm a big fan of the Exchange, and we're getting lots of calls every day for people who want to 8 enroll and have insurance. 9 MS. KORBULIC: Thank you very much. 10 DR. JAMESON: Thank you for that feedback. 11 Okay. If no other feedback, no other comment, 12 13 public comment, then I would ask for a motion to adjourn. 14 MR. BRANCH: This is Quincy. 15 MR. MELENDREZ: This is Jose. Motion to 16 adjourn. 17 DR. JAMESON: And all those in favor of 18 adjourning, "aye." 19 20 (Board members said "aye.") 21 DR. JAMESON: The meeting is adjourned.
